L.L. Bean Snowshoes at TPL!



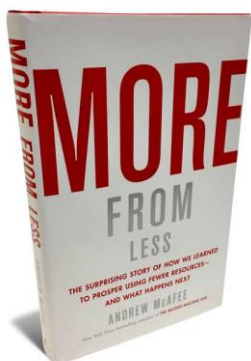

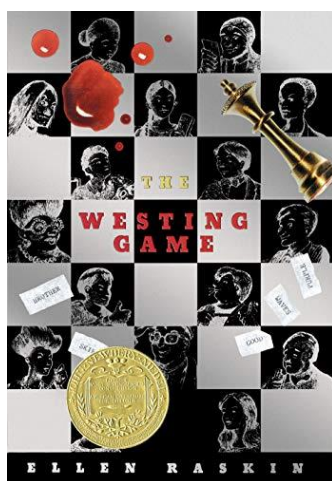
The Westing Game
